Topics include apartment search and applications, presentation when applying and what to ask and look for prior to moving in. Offered through SMOC's Housing Consumer Education Center.</p>	<p>Banking:</p> <p>This workshop is designed explain the basics of banking. Topics include types of banking accounts, credit unions vs banks, how to balance a checking account and how to open a bank account. Offered through SMOC's Housing Consumer Education Center.</p>
